Message 3:

"Follow Me"

Part 2

Luke 9:23 / John 12:24-26

Imtroduction:

Over the past few weeks we have given consideration to the meaning of Christ's words to us concerning being His disciple.

Through the Scriptures we have studied the Holy Spirit has revealed to us the job description Jesus provided for all who would seek to be His disciples.

Luke 9:23

23 And He was saying to them all, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow Me.

We have already explored the first two expectations in detail;

Denial of self and taking up our cross daily.

We know that these two must take place in order for us to be able to follow Jesus.

Jesus chose to use the words "Follow Me".

John 12:24-26

24 Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

John 12:24-26

25 He who loves his life loses it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it to life eternal.

John 12:24-26

26 If anyone serves Me, he must follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also; if anyone serves Me, the Father will honor him.

These two words "Follow Me" indicate that Jesus is going somewhere. Jesus is moving, on a journey, and He desires us to join Him on this journey. Jesus is inviting you to join Him in His work of building the Kingdom of God. He has called us to believe in Him.

The purpose of His gift of salvation
was not for us to simply know
we are going to make it into heaven.
It was not given to us so we could simply
gain as much information about God
as we can until we go.
He calls us to worship and to serve.

He equips us to produce fruit for His kingdom.

When we begin to follow we move into an experience of fruitfulness for God.

Our following Jesus now is preparation for the eternal ministry He has for us in His Kingdom to come.

Last week we began to look at the 4 essentials that we must know and do in order to complete the step of following Jesus.

Here are the 4 essentials:

- 1. We must clearly hear the voice of Jesus
- 2. We must stay focused on Jesus
- 3. We must completely trust Jesus
- 4. We must fully obey Jesus

Last week we gave focus to the first essential.

Here is a quick review.

1. We must clearly hear the voice of Jesus

a. A believer cannot follow Jesus if the believer is not confident that he or she is hearing Jesus instructions clearly.

Being confident that you are hearing the voice of God is a vital key to be able to follow.

b. Jesus said in John 10: 1-5; 14 that His sheep (followers) know Him and know His voice enabling them to follow Him.

John 10:1-5; 14

1 "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter by the door into the fold of the sheep, but climbs up some other way, he is a thief and a robber.

John 10:1-5; 14

2 But he who enters by the door is a shepherd of the sheep.

John 10:1-5; 14

3 To him the doorkeeper opens, and the sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.

John 10:1-5; 14

4 When he puts forth all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice.

John 10:1-5; 14

5 A stranger they simply will not follow, but will flee from him, because they do not know the voice of strangers."

John 10:1-5; 14

14 I am the good shepherd, and I know My own and My own know Me,

c. The primary key to knowing the voice of Jesus is abiding in the Word of God.

(Abide = time, obedience, evaluation)

In John 8:31-32 Jesus told us that abiding in His Word will set us free.

d. We each must believe the truth that Jesus desires to communicate with us in order to enjoy a relationship with us and to provide guidance for us. We must determine to make the hearing of Jesus voice the top priority of our lives and we must make His voice the final authority of truth for us.

e. God speaks to us in 4 primary ways. The First and primary way is through the Word of God, the Bible. Second is prayer. This is God placing His thoughts into our minds and confirming it in our spirit by His Holy Spirit who has come to live in us as we believe. These first two must be experienced before God will use circumstances (Third way) and other believers (Fourth way) to confirm.

f. If we look first to circumstances or other believers then we can fall into a trap of trying to force God's Word and will into our desires. God does speak through all 4 ways however, what He is saying will always line up with His Word.

g. Jesus wants us to be confident.

If God's Word indicates a direction and in prayer you believe God is saying something to you then trust Him and begin to move in that direction.

God can mold and direct us best as we are moving in trust.

If we are stuck in fear of making a mistake God has a more difficult time teaching us how to hear with confidence.

h. You cannot miss God's will ifthree steps

1. Truly surremder the choice to God.

Be really willing to obey
however God leads

2. Make a decision and start obeying based upon God's Word and upon what you believe He is saying

3. Trust God.
If you are not going the right way and you truly surrendered God will intervene and make the path clear

2. We must stay focused on Jesus

a. In Luke 9: 57-62 Jesus encounters several who say they wish to follow Him.

The problem was found in their focus.

Jesus uses these illustrations to say He must be the priority focus.

ь. Hebrews 12:2 tells us to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus

- c. To focus on Jesus is to:
- 1. Meditate on His love for us
- 2. <u>Remember His call</u> on our lives (salvation / service)
- 3. <u>Embrace by faith His presence-</u> He is always with us

4. Follow His example from Scripture-

as we study how Jesus lived from the Gospels we can pattern our lives after His example.

The instructions from the Apostles in the New Testament also provide God's desires for how we are to follow Jesus example.

Following Jesus example is possible when we know what He desires and we surrender to the Holy Spirit's control as we choose to follow in obedient faith.

5. Be alert to the opportunities He places in our path while on our journey with Him-

this means being spiritually alert to His working in the lives of people we encounter and being alert to open doors for us to share His Gospel and truths from His Word.

3. We must completely trust Jesus

a. <u>Jesus will always lead us</u> where faith in Him will be required.

One way we know it is Jesus voice is the confirmation of God's Word.

A second way is that the choice of obedience will require that we grow in our trust in God.

ь. Jesus leads us on paths of dependence.

He will lead us where we must trust Him for resources, for open doors for ministry, to change people's hearts, etc.

He will lead us to experiences where he can work through our lives and God alone will receive the Glory.

c. This level of trust will require that we let go of our self-sufficiency and our need to be in control

4. We must fully obey Jesus

a. <u>Partial obedience</u> is not following Jesus.

God's Word is clear that He gives His favor and strong support to those who stand ready to fully obey without compromise.

b. We must be careful to not view God's support from a world perspective of success.

For example, Stephen was fully obedient and he was stoned to death.

His faith, which he demonstrated in his death, was used by God to begin to break the heart of Saul who became Paul.

c. Strong support or favor means to be used supernaturally by God for whatever purpose is best for building the Kingdom of God. Often we cannot see the big picture but we trust God and follow in obedience.

d. Jesus leads us from one crossroad of trust to another. All along the journey we will face new levels of needed trust to continue to follow in obedience. Every time our faith is stretched God draws us closer to Himself in intimacy and God uses us to produce fruit for His kingdom.

e. As His followers we cannot simply stop and say let's stay here. (Peter on the Mt. of transfiguration) Jesus continues to move and encourages us to follow. We will either follow or fall back. Clearly Jesus does lead us, when needed, into seasons of rest but it should only be a season and not a permanent place of dwelling.

Where do you go for counsel?

What serves as your final authority for life?

2. Where is your focus?

Is it on yourself, your circumstances, others, or is it on Jesus?

As Jesus evaluates your following would He describe you as one who hears, stays focused, trusts, and fully obeys His voice?

3. Are there any areas of life where Jesus would say; "this needs to be surrendered to Me"?

Any areas where Jesus is saying; "stay focused on Me, trust Me, and obey Me fully"?
